Our next meeting will be on **Saturday**, October 23, at **4:30** p.m. in the Robert L. Annis Playhouse at the Westminster Conservatory (formerly, the Westminster Choir College). The Conservatory is located near downtown Princeton and can be reached by Route 206 from most locations. We require attendees to be fully vaccinated, and masks will be required while inside. We'll send a reminder, directions, and a request for program information a few days before the meeting. J

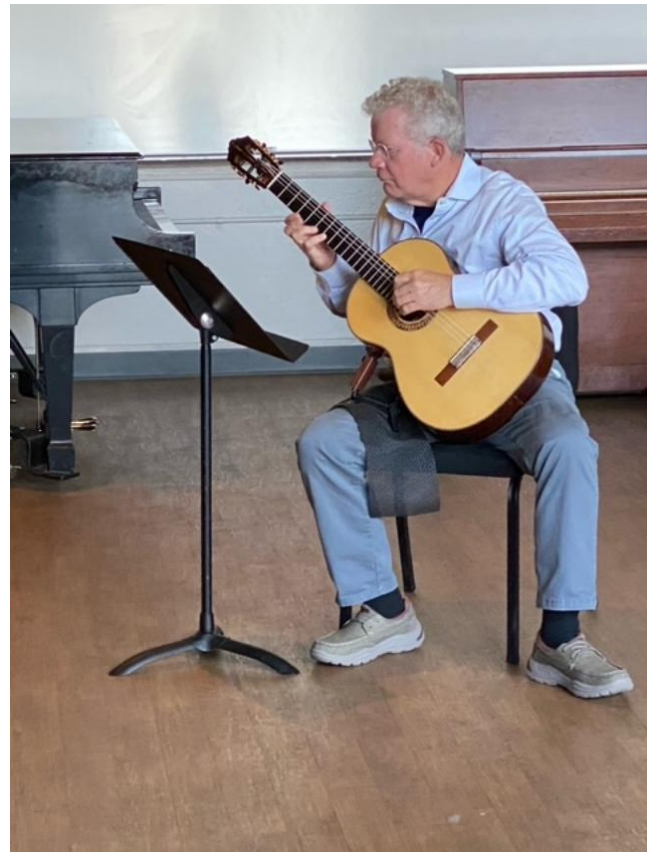
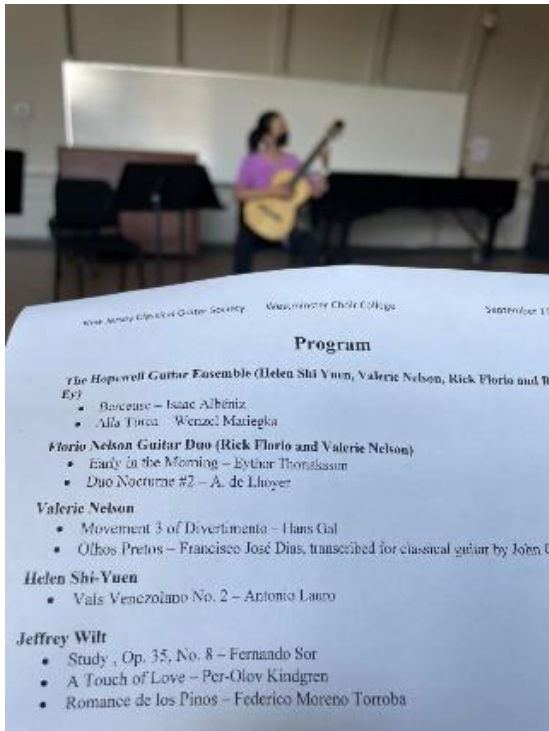
