
Book Corner

Books about the guitar was one of the topics discussed at the February meeting. Here are some of our favorites that belong on your reading list.

My First Guitar: Tales of True Love and Lost Chords from 70 Legendary Musicians, by Julia Crowe


Guitarist, writer, and composerJulia Crowe was inspired to write *My First Guitar* at a 2003 house concert and release party featuring New Jersey's own Michael Newman and Laura Oltman. She found that, while guitarists may go on to greater things, a first guitar is never forgotten and has a story of its own. It "is the first



guitar that has a special place, no matter how cheap, battered, or unplayable it might have been. This first guitar is the Herald, the awakener of the impulse to play, and the impulse that will become a lifelong rapport." Crowe began aggressively collecting these stories from every guitarist she could persuade to tell them. Covering diverse genres, the book includes interviews with Frederic Hand, Benjamin Verdery and the Los Angeles Guitar Quartet.

Guitar: an American Life, by Tim Brooks

This is a fabulous collection of guitar lore that puts more focus on the guitar itself, in it's various incarnations (and on guitar culture) than on the well-known (and sometimes not so well-known) players who tell its story. NPR produced an excellent and extensive feature on the book that includes my favorite quote: "You start off playing guitar to get chicks and end up talking with middle-aged


